On Campus

Pine View has instituted a new program, Building Buddies, to give students the opportunity to make new friends at other schools, and to reach out and help their community. →

Students are teaming up with Memorial Elementary School in Arcadia this year. The program kicked off in September when more than 50 PV kids went to Memorial to distribute backpacks and school supplies to the more than 800 students at the Arcadia school. DeSoto County was among the most devastated areas of Florida after Hurricane Charley, and more than 50 Memorial students were left homeless, reported the *Sarasota Herald-Tribune*. Many others lost countless possessions. Pine View School donated an additional \$10,000 from its reserves, and the Pine View Association donated \$1,000. Kids from both schools enjoyed a Popsicle party to celebrate.

“I was stunned,” Memorial Principal Dale Wolgast

told the *Herald-Tribune*. “I had no idea that that was in the works. To know that it came from staff to staff, it couldn’t be more special.”

DeSoto County Schools Superintendent Adrian Cline said the money would most likely go toward computer equipment, more school supplies, or items for the media center.

The program is yearlong, including a book drive in October to benefit the Arcadia school’s media center and students’ personal book collections, and an ongoing pen-pal system between classes.

Building Buddies is similar to a program Pine View adopted after Hurricane Andrew with an elementary school in South Florida.
